

Application to Direct a Play in the *12th Annual Playwrights' Festival*

Directors are needed for *The 12th Annual Playwrights' Festival*. In order to set up the applicants for success in this position, they will undergo hours of training in a series of Directing Labs throughout the late winter and early spring. This training will help ensure that each director is ready for the demanding tasks that will face them: developing a vision, casting a show, coaching actors, blocking scenes, scheduling, collaborating with designers, and much more. This will also serve as invaluable training for those who are considering directing other productions within Theatre Ink. Students from 9th through 12th grade are invited to apply.

Applicants will be chosen for the Directing Labs based on the strength of their application, past experience with the *Playwrights' Festival* and/or Theatre Ink, plans for directing in the future, and their availability on all important production dates. In April they will propose their visions for which shows they would like to direct through a separate process.

HOW TO APPLY:

- Read the description of the directing process.
- Read the list of important dates and write down any conflicts you may have.
- Fill out the application as clearly and concisely as possible.
- Submit your application (**the last three pages of this packet *only***) to the folder on the Playwrights' callboard next to Room 171 by **January 22nd**.

A DESCRIPTION OF THE DIRECTING PROCESS

- STEP 1: Students interested in directing will submit applications. **All qualified applicants will be accepted.** Refer to the second paragraph on the cover of this packet for what constitutes a qualified applicant. [January 2019]
- STEP 2: All prospective directors will attend **Directing Labs I, II, & III** as part of their training for STEP 3. [Feb-March 2019]
- STEP 3: All candidates will submit the **first draft** of their visions for **up to three plays** in the Festival. After receiving feedback from the faculty advisers, they will then submit a **second draft** of these visions. [March-April 2019]
- STEP 4: Based on the submitted visions, **directors will be paired with plays.** Please note that, depending on the size of the pool of candidates, this may mean that some candidates will not be chosen to direct a play. It is also important to note that playwrights who participate in the Directing Labs do not automatically get to direct their own plays; they must apply like all other candidates. [April 2019]
- STEP 5: After attending Directing Lab IV, the chosen directors will collaborate together to **audition** and **cast** actors. [April 2019]
- STEP 6: Directors will **plan** and **run rehearsals, meeting with a faculty adviser** all along the way to help them reflect and improve their practice. [May 2019]
- STEP 7: The Festival will be performed three times; **directors will participate in talkbacks** after each show. [June 2019]
- STEP 8: Directors will be asked to **reflect on the process** during a post-mortem meeting. [June 2019]

IMPORTANT DATES

Directing a play – even a ten-minute play – is a big commitment. Applicants *must* be available on all of the following dates – no exceptions.

Directing Labs – Wednesdays from 6 PM – 8:30 PM

- **February 6th** – Directing Lab I – *Interpreting a Script & Actor Coaching*
- **February 27th** – Directing Lab II – *Blocking & Running a Rehearsal*
- **March 20th** – Directing Lab III – *Finding a Vision*
- **April 10th** – Directing Lab IV – *Casting/Callbacks & Scheduling*
- **May 2nd **(3:30-5PM)**** – Directing Lab V – *Working with Designers*

Other Important Dates

- **April 23rd & 24th** – Auditions
- **April 25th** – Callbacks
- **April 26th** – Casting the Festival
- **April 29th – May 29th** – Directors will hold rehearsals two-three times a week for one-two hours. These will be held at North on school days and will end no later than 6 PM.
- ***likely* May 13th** – Designer Run (*actors/designers/directors must attend*)
- **May 31st/June 1st**– Tech Friday (2:30 – 9pm)/ Saturday (9am – 6pm)
- **June 4th** – Dress Rehearsal
- **June 6th, 7th, & 8th** – Performances

CONFLICTS

Directors must be present for all dates listed on Page 2 of this application. It is understood that emergencies may arise, however: if a student is forced to miss more than one Directing Lab, they may lose their position as a director.
